- 1 Would you like to be chased by dogs? Most people would say no. But now, more people in England and Wales are choosing to do exactly that. They run across the countryside while bloodhounds follow their smell. This activity may soon be the only legal way to hunt with dogs.
- 2 The government plans to stop trail hunting, where dogs follow an animal scent. Because of this, people are becoming interested in a new activity called "clean-boot hunting." In this activity, dogs do not chase animals. Instead, they chase human volunteers. Both animal protection groups and some former hunters support this idea.
- 3 In clean-boot hunting, bloodhounds and horse riders chase runners instead of foxes. On this day, I am one of the runners. I am joining the New Forest Hounds, feeling nervous but curious.
- 4 I am told this is not a blood sport. Bloodhounds are different from foxhounds. They do not attack or hurt people. Will Day, one of the hunt leaders, says the dogs are friendly and gentle.
- 5 Before the hunt starts, I have to get into a lorry with the dogs so they can smell me. They told me not to shower or use deodorant, so my body smell is stronger. This helps the dogs follow me later.
- 6 Will Day says he now believes this is the future of hunting. He explains, "Society moves on and you have to move with it." He says he was surprised by how fun the activity is.
- 7 They give the runners a head start. We run away from the dogs, leaving the paths and going through bushes and plants. Soon, we hear loud barking behind us. The sound gets closer, and my heart starts to beat faster.
- 8 Bloodhounds are very good at tracking people. People use them around the world to find missing people. On this rough land, they can run much faster than humans. We cannot escape.
- 9 When the dogs get close, we hide and stop moving. Soon, the dogs find us. They push us with wet noses and excited energy. Any fear disappears quickly. They are friendly and do not hurt us.
- 10 After catching us, the dogs lose interest and are ready to go again. During the day, we run many times and travel several miles. The dogs always find us. Being chased like this is scary but also exciting, and much more thrilling than a normal run.
