


Solutions for English Teaching

MULTIPLE-CHOICE BOARD GAME

Type of activity: Level:	game all levels
Language needed:	can be adapted to any lesson
Approximate time:	15 minutes
Materials:	colored pieces of paper, whiteboard, tape

Procedure

1. Draw a line of boxes on the board (as many as you feel you have time for)



- 2. Divide the class into 4 groups. Give each group a different colored set of A/B/C/D cards. Tape a small strip of paper by "Start" on the board for each group. Each team's marker should be the same color as their A/B/C/D cards.
- 3. <u>Variation A</u>: *The teacher reads the questions and choices*.

The students listen to the first question and the 4 multiple choice answers. They have about 20 seconds to talk about the answer. The teacher then says, "1, 2, 3!" A representative from each group holds up their answer on "3". The teacher moves the markers of the teams who answered correctly to the first square on the board. Continue with as many questions as time allows. The team who has advanced the furthest on the board wins.

<u>Variation B</u>: *Each group has a list of questions and multiple-choice answers to look at. The teacher tells them which question to look at next.*

Possible questions: -TOEIC grammar questions (the students must <u>read</u> the questions) -Trivia (questions with past tense verbs, etc.) -Review (a mixture of different types of questions) -Vocabulary (choose the correct definition for a word or choose the correct word for a definition)

This is a very simple idea, but it works well and the students enjoy it!



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
