do that?

Kara: I don't know what you mean.

Martin: Last night, when I came back you asked me if I'd found the spy. I told you he'd managed

to escape, that someone must have warned him. And you said – 'It wasn't me'.

Kara: I didn't lie to you.

Martin: You're doing it again. Why are you lying to me?

Kara: I'm not lying to you!

Martin: And this morning ... you left me alone. You broke your promise.

Martin: You promised not to leave me! Kara. Why are you looking at me like that?

Kara: Like what?

Martin: Like ... like you hate me. Like you want to kill me.
